School Athletics Day | Friday 14 February

We are looking forward to hosting our full-school Athletics day on Friday February 14th. All students are expected to attend and take part in this whole-school event. There will be housedbased fun activities as well as competitive athletics events throughout the day. See below for details:

Venue: Navigation Homes Stadium, Pukekohe

Arrival and departure: 8:45am start. Students are to go directly to the stadium where they will assemble in their Whānau Rōpū classes. Rolls will be taken by Kaiaawhina. At approximately 2:30pm students will be dismissed from the venue. Entrance to the venue is at Gate D. There will be a drop off area available for vehicles.

Students will not be allowed to leave during the day unless they have a leave pass organised prior.

Gear: Mufti/House colours. Hat and sunscreen. Please Note: NO Face Paint and feathers are allowed to be brought into the stadium.

Sign-ups for events: Students should complete the link that has been sent to your year level teams page/notice board for competitive events. This link will close on Tuesday 12 February at 12pm. House-based activities require no sign-ups.

<u>Food:</u> There will be some food available for purchase at the venue. Students are encouraged to bring their own food and a bottle of water for the day. Extra water will be available at the stadium.

Spectators: Whaanau are welcome to attend as spectators. We will have a designated seating area for spectators in the stadium.


